REQUEST 8 TOTAL CREDITS and 4 Alternates

Students attending Lynden High School take 8 classes per semester. When students earn a passing grade, they are awarded 0.5 credits for each semester class. Some classes continue for a full year – however, each semester’s credit is earned and awarded separately. Students need to earn a minimum of 29 credits in specific subject areas in order to graduate. The required courses and additional elective opportunities for SENIORS are outlined below.

It is intentional for seniors to have less required courses than junior, sophomore years. This allows opportunity to take additional core courses for a competitive and rigorous transcript, to dive into areas of interest, and to take courses that align with their High School and Beyond Plan
